PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Another season is over and I hope everyone enjoyed his or her soccer in 2002.

This year the club fielded 13 junior teams and 2 senior teams, 3 teams less than last year. Regardless of this, the club has had a very good year.

Whilst I expect we have come runners up in the Club Championship to Yamba, our least successful team has accumulated 12 competition points for the season which shows a reasonably high standard for the club. A major contributor to the good performance of the club is Rob Leek. His coaching sessions during the season have been great for players and other coaches. He has put a lot of time and effort into our club and I would like to thank him for it.

Also for the older age groups and seniors, they have been well organised this year thanks to Geoff Martin and Dennis Pearce. The blooding of a number of the juniors into the senior ranks has been great for the club and this years good results will only improve.

However, these are not the only reasons for my enthusiasm. I consider this year a success in the organisation of the club. While last year we had a relatively new committee with a few teething problems, this year the club is now considered one of the best organised in the competition. For this I cannot take much credit as it is the efforts of the rest of the committee – Stewart Purser, Ann Pursey, Dennis Pearce and non-elected club persons such as the rest of the Purser family, Geoff Martin (Life Member), Lesley Wall, Jackie Walder & John Pitkin that have made the difference. They have been regulars at the club meetings and put in a lot of hard yards for the club.

The main source of complaints this year was again from the size of the fees. We were hit with further increases from above, this year mainly due to the Soccer Australia levy. However, it should be noted that we were able to minimise the increase to less than the cost of the levy. Our sponsorship committee of Jackie Walder & Dennis Pearce are doing a great job of finding sponsors to help keep our fees down.

The Parkview Hotel kindly provided their major sponsorship for this year prior to the fire. After an appropriate period of mourning and counselling sessions for some of the seniors, a new sponsor in the form of the Crown Hotel has been found.

The Westlawn carnival went well this year. I had a number of people from other clubs approach me to say it was one of the friendliest carnivals to go to (this was said last year as well!). This is a credit to the sportsmanship of the parents and officials that were there.

And thank you to all committee members, coaches, managers, parents and extended families for their participation, positive support and helping the club continue to provide games of soccer for the players. I hope you all will continue enjoying soccer with Westlawn again next year.

I will now give a plug for the **AGM on 22**nd **October, 6:30pm at the Crown Hotel**. I hope all teams will have at least one representative at the meeting as we need your presence for the club to function. There will be vacancies to fill so you need to help in some form if you want the club to do well.

I should mention that this term will be my last on the committee for a year or two. With the retirement of life member, Trevor Ellem, from the Ground Controller position a few months ago, this left me as the longest serving committee member with only 3 years service! I've had a great time doing the job this year thanks to the team work of the others in the club and their positive attitudes. I wish you all the best for the next few seasons.

JUNIOR CLUB COACH'S REPORT 2002

I don't know about the coaches and players, I have learnt a lot in my first year of being a junior club coach. The difference between U/6's and U/12's is astounding, and I need to prepare myself a little better for next season. Hopefully I will be able to prepare a simple manual for the kit bags with ideas for coaching the basics of soccer, training drills for skills and movement, vision on the field, tricks and positional play.

Coaching any team is never simple, you need to be: a teacher, a diplomat, a mind reader, smile and be happy when your not, a mediator, a referee and a child and parent psychologist. I would like to thank every Coach and Manager for their effort this year and to remind you that it does get easier every year. My own coaching challenge this year in both Club soccer and Rep soccer has been trying to find training drills that will develop my new players and at the same time improve my better players skill level and vision.

Have you noticed an improvement this year in:

- 1. Locking your Ankle. Hopefully you have notice that the players are kicking the ball further than before, have more strength when they are tackling, and controlling their trapping better. Locking your ankle is the first basic of soccer, it is tensing your calf muscle to make your foot stiff and is heavily involved in the three points above.
- 2. Accuracy and Balance when Passing. You must stand on one foot to kick a ball and being able to balance one both feet means you can kick with both feet. If you draw a straight line from your heel to your toe on the foot on the ground, this is the direction the ball will go if you lock your ankle and kick the ball with the inside of you foot. If this sounds too simple try it.
- 3. The First Touch. The most important touch is the first one every time you get the ball. One of the hardest things to coach a player is not to kick the ball away first time as far as you can but to trap the ball in the direction you want to go and to look up and pass the ball to a team mate. Remember if you kick the ball out you are freely giving the opposition the ball. Does your team try and pass or just kick and chase.
- 4. Tricks or Deception. Have you seen any players trying their tricks. I have seen a number of boys and girls try them. Remember as a coach we must praise the effort because it is very hard to get tricks right in a game until you try them a few times.
- 5. Heading. We have learnt this year what part of the ball to keep your eyes on The Bottom and which part of our foreheads to use. Have we improved.
