

PRESIDENT's REPORT

Welcome to the 2013 AGM. Our club has had another successful season both on and off the field during 2013.

I must congratulate all the teams on their sportsmanship throughout the season. The club's success this year has been in the juniors with 3 teams being minor premiers out of 4 divisions. At the time of writing, we have the 14's and 12's who will be contesting the grand final in their divisions. The 12's, 14's and 16's will also be the Clarence area representatives in the championship against minor premiers of the southern area. Unfortunately our senior teams failed to make an impact on the ladders in their various divisions. We were able to be competitive in the majority of our games but I feel that lady luck deserted the club. Balls off the post would miss goal whereas it would go in for the opposition. The premier league side may have to play off with the leading 2nd division side for the right to compete in that competition next season. Good luck to our 12's and 14's in their grand finals and the three teams competing in the champion of champions. I thank Rob Usher for the work he has put into our senior teams. The results are certainly not a reflection of his commitment and passion to the game. As I mentioned before, a favourable bounce of the ball on occasions would certainly have meant that we would not be in a playoff position for the premier division. Our reserves comprising of 6 to 7 of our under 16's and capably supported by the little general Tony Powell on and off the field showed massive heart to turn up each week and represent our club. In the last round they managed a win over the team running 2nd. These young men were playing Friday nights then backing up on Saturday or Sunday all season. Our club will be rewarded in the next couple of years by these juniors who now move into senior ranks. The Panthers found that they were certainly in the wrong grade as they are not getting any younger and though competing could not turn them into favourable results. Third division beckons for 2014.

The women's team following the success of last season were unable to match it with the top teams although they had their share of success against some of the semi finalists. Injuries and the loss of key personnel from last season meant that it was a bit of a rebuilding year. My thanks to Lesley for the efforts inputting the team together and for getting them to their games all season. Women's football is still of a high priority within our club. Our junior playing numbers continue to remain strong. We had nearly the same numbers in under 6 and 7's as the rest of the upper Clarence clubs combined. Our overall registration in excess of 300 makes us one of the

largest clubs in the NCF.

Off the field, the club has been successful in developing a second large field on the athletics field. This has proved to be of great success as it has taken the pressure off the over use of field no.1. resulting in what I believe is the best field we have seen all season at any venue. It will also enable the club to continue to grow as we can cater for more teams (Under 12's to Premier League) who play on full size fields. We have also purchased new nets so that all our fields now have the right size nets stored in individually marked bins. We also hope that the pond will be drained before next season. As this is my last report as President of the Westlawn Tigers, there are several people who I must thank for their support over my 3 year tenure. The job is made so much easier when we have people of the quality of Sharon Powell our secretary, Registrar Kylie Baker, treasurer James Joyce, vice presidents Peter Fysh and Liz Weatherstone, equipment officer Mick Bowles and the rest of the committee. I would not swap any of them and everyone can remember junior presentation day and the sterling job that Liz did. The Kippax's also deserve an honourable mention. One phone call and the BBQ was manned. Also Shorn elected to support the reserve grade over his beloved Panthers in our hour of need.

I would also like to mention Jenny Cotton who not only gives us financial sponsorship each year but also can be seen at most senior games serving and running the canteen even though she has no one actively involved. People like her make this club so special.

Finally the coaches and team managers for the important roles they play. Without good coaching the players skills cannot be developed which in turn brings success on the playing field. We encourage all interested in coaching to get accreditation as FFA is heading down the path of mandatory coaching qualifications. The club is also looking to appoint a coaching director to further improve our skills in this area.

Our major fundraising this year was the directory deliveries, the junior carnival and the Calcutta. To all those who assisted us to make these a success, thanks.

It would be remiss if I did not thank my wife Heather and Adam and Lauren for their support during the past 3 years.

To all our sponsors, especially the major one in the Crown Hotel thanks for your support. Without you it would be very difficult to run a successful club. Go the Tigers in 2014.

There are numerous other people such as John Nelson and Anita Jackson who have been of great support to me and made the journey of the past three years very memorable. The parents, players and support staff are like one big family and the Westlawn Tigers will always have a fondness in my heart. I am not leaving the club, just changing my role as Adam most probably only has two more years with the club.
