FINANCIAL STATUS

Our club is in a sound financial position due to the following:

- strong volunteer contribution that reduces some costs
- large player base for our region
- improvements in player fee recovery
- dedicated volunteer canteen management to maximize profits

We are exposed to some risk as we do not have a significant asset base, and rely on volunteer contributions to minimize costs to allow us sufficient funds to properly resource facilities and our player base. We also compete with other sports, particularly when association expenses make it difficult to price competitively.

There are opportunities to improve our position through the following:

- continued focus on fee recovery
- implementation of facilities management, and club strategic plans
- improvements in sponsorship opportunities
- capacity for improved marketing of the sport within the region.

We will continue to make our organization attractive to players and sponsors to continually improve our financial position with a view to sustainability.
